Nurse's Notes

This week is a DO week for SWITCH. What physical activity have you added? Sometimes we just need the extra push to just DO IT. Choose a plan. It needs to be something that works for you. The goals need to be realistic and achievable. Start with a short goal and work towards a long term plan. Build in some resistance training. This doesn't mean you have to "lift weights". Using your own body weight is good. Muscle mass naturally declines as we get older. Resistance training slows that process down. Make it convenient. Pack your gym bag and have it in the car. How can you move more during your day? The SWITCH program encourages 60 minutes of physical activity for children and 30 minutes for adults. Sometimes you just need to get your body moving and your mind will follow. Marianne Hickey RN


