Fire Prevention Week

Fire Prevention week is October 9- 15.

"Fires Won't Wait. Plan Your Escape".

Kindergarten, first and second grades will be visiting the Gilbertville Fire Station on October 11 to learn about fire safety.

The Fire Safety House will be here Tuesday, October 11 for our 3-4-5 grades to tour. The Fire Safety House is a mobile, fire education tool designed to teach vital burn prevention and fire escape methods through a fun, safe simulation of common household hazards. The Fire Safety House is equipped with a kitchen, living room and bedroom, which features the types of dangers children, should look for.

In addition, the house fills with non-toxic smoke to teach children to crawl low to safety. A heated door helps children choose the right exit. An escape ladder in the bedroom allows them to practice emergency escapes.

We want to encourage our families to attend Mass together. Last year we asked students to bring a bulletin to get their name into a drawing for donuts with Mrs. Douglas. We are changing it up just a little bit this year. Starting in October students will get a monthly "passport". Each passport has a space for a stamp for each of the Sundays during the month. Students take their passports to Mass and use the stamps at the back of church to fill in the boxes (only one stamp per week). On Monday students can bring the passports to school for teachers to initial. At the end of the month students will use the boxes on the passport to enter into the drawing for donuts with Mrs. Douglas.

Thank you for your involvement in the Bosco Catholic School System to improve education here and throughout


the state.

Dear Families,

The time is here for your student and his/her teacher to share with you about your student's overall progress. All students in grades K-8 are required to participate in the conferences. Students, parents, and teachers should all participate in the conference.

Conferences will be:

3:00 - 7:00 PM on Monday, October 17 3:00 - 7:00 PM on Tuesday, October 18 There will be no classes Friday, October 21.

Parents will schedule conferences online with the Parent Teacher Conference (PTC) scheduler on our website. K-5 conferences will be scheduled in 15 minute increments. 6-8 and specials conferences will be scheduled in 10 minute increments. Instructions for scheduling conferences are below.

Conferences for **grades K-5** should be scheduled with the student's homeroom teacher.

6-8 grade conferences:

If the student's last name is A - Nie, please schedule with Mrs. Bergfeld (Mr. Wymore will also be present). Last names Nissen - Z, please schedule with Mrs. Zimmerman (Mr. Armbruster will also be present). Middle school students only need one scheduled conference with Bergfeld/Wymore or Zimmerman/Armbruster. You may schedule additional conferences with specials teachers.

The PTC scheduler will go live on our website Friday, September 30 at 7:00 in the morning. Please sign in and schedule your conferences. You may schedule conferences from September 30 at 7:00am until October 16 at midnight. Anyone who does not schedule a conference time will be assigned a conference time. Please print or write down your conference schedule.

You will not be able to go back to it after October 16 at midnight.

PTC Registration Process for Parents/Guardians

To Start

- On our website https://www.boscocatholic.org/ click on Parent Resources then Parent Teacher Conferences. This link http://www.boscocatholic.org/vparentteacher/ will also take you to the registration/sign in screen.
- Sign In or new families Sign Up

Signing Up for Parent-Teacher Conferences

K-5 conferences will be scheduled in 15-minute increments. Grades 6-8 + specials will be scheduled in 10-minute increments.

- **Step 1:** Choose the conference date and grade of students and you will be taken to a list of teachers.
- **Step 2:** Select the teacher(s) you wish to conference with from the list or start typing the last name in the "Search Teacher" field

Note: You can reserve time with up to eight teachers. You can register for additional teachers once you complete the current process.

- **Step 3:** Enter the student's name.
- Step 4: Click continue.
- **Step 5:** Check the box next to the conference times(s) you wish to reserve.
- **Step 6:** Click Update.

The timeframe/s you chose will be colored green. Watch your times, do not double book with two teachers at the same time.

At this point you may sign up for conferences for additional students in that same grade group by clicking on the "Teacher Selection" button at the bottom of the page.

To schedule a student in another grade group click your name next to "Signed in as" then the "Home" (house) button, then repeat step 1-6.



At the bottom of the screen you will see the confirmation of your conference registration. You will have the option to "click here to print" to get a copy of your Conference Registration Report.
