We hope you are all talking at home about the habit of the month: Be Proactive! A key concept in being proactive is taking the time to pause before reacting to a situation. Did you know that there is space between every stimulus and response? Did you know that we can all train ourselves to create even more space between the stimulus and our response?

When difficult challenges come your way, you have choices.

- Reactive choices can cause you to feel sad, angry, or frustrated inside. Reactive choices can cause further problems.
- Proactive choices can cause you to feel good, happy, and satisfied inside. Proactive choices help prevent further problems.

Nurse's Notes

Consider making a holiday wellness plan. Choose a goal. Is it to maintain your weight, stay active as the weather gets cooler, eat healthy at holiday parties, stress less, or avoid overspending? Then break the goal down into small measurable goals. To maintain your weight you could plan to pack your lunch 3 days a week. To be active you could plan an active time for 30 minutes 3 times a week. Even if you have to break it down to 3 10 minute sessions it is good. Add a serving of fruits or vegetables as a snack between lunch and supper. Start your day with a healthy breakfast for 5 days. Examine your budget. Where could you cut back? Maybe not stop for that "special coffee" but brew your own 4 days a week. Reduce stress by making a list. Try to get 7-8 hours of sleep. Spend 15 minutes 3 times a week reading before bed.
