From Mrs. Neverman... First Grade Reindeer Races

A favorite STEM activity in first grade has been the rocket races. We switched out rockets for reindeer as that was a subject we investigated and learned about in December. We had planned to have a flying reindeer competition to end that month, but we decided to postpone our race because many of our classmates were ill and we didn't want them to miss out. So, this week we built reindeer out of toilet paper tubes, pipe cleaners, and balloons. Names were given to these wonderful creatures and the competition was on!

This activity is an introduction for students to practice critical thinking skills and explore concepts that would be very challenging when simply read about in a book. We made predictions about which direction our reindeer needed to go and how the balloon would make this happen. We figured out that the line needed to stay taunt and maybe holding the line up higher at the beginning of the race could help our reindeer fly faster, and the heavier reindeer may move slower than those that are of a lesser weight. All great observations and thoughts!

This activity is really a very simple Physics lesson! First Graders and Physics, who would ever guess that? Now we know these first graders will not understand Newton's Law of Motion, but we are planting the seeds of inquiry and wonder. Later this semester simple activities involving moving air will be completed and the seeds planted this week in these first graders' minds will allow them to question and make reasonable deductions about motion, compressed air, force, and action-reaction.

The best part of this introductory lesson was seeing students work together and have fun!



- I hear, I believe, I observe, I see, I think, I noticed
- 2. How it makes you feel
- I feel, I am experiencing
- 3. What you need to happen next
- I need, I want, I prefer


