Nurse's Notes

Maybe instead of trying to change unhealthy eating habits we can try adding healthy habits. Adding healthy foods and gradually reducing unhealthy foods may be the key to staying with a healthy lifestyle. It may take trying a new food up to 12 times for a child to accept the food. Start out with small portions. Be sure that they see you eating the food also. Try one new food at a time. Offering too many new foods at one time can be overwhelming. GRW T-Ball & Boys Pitching Machine League

The 2023 GRW T-Ball and Boys Pitching Machine League sign up is underway. To be eligible for <u>GRW T-Ball</u>, your son or daughter must be 4 years old by April 21 and no older than first grade in the fall. To be eligible for the <u>Boys Pitching Machine</u> League, your son must be going in to 1st grade in the fall and not older than 4th grade in the fall. (Current Kindergarten boys can choose to either play t-ball or the pitching machine league. Parents will need to make that determination based on what they feel is appropriate for their child.)

Entry fee is \$25.00 per child. Checks should be made out to GRW T-Ball/Pitching Machine. Games will begin on **April 20/21** and played every Thursday/Friday night for approximately 6 weeks at the Gilbertville softball complex.




