Nurse's Notes

April is Oral Cancer Awareness month. It is important that oral cancer screenings are done with routine dental visits. Dentists play an important role in early detection. Risk factors include HPV, smoking, chewing tobacco and alcohol use. If a lesion is found during examination a biopsy of the area should be done. Signs according to Mayo Clinic may be a sore on the lip or mouth that does not heal, a whitish or reddish patch inside your mouth that does not heal, a growth or lump in your mouth. You may experience mouth or ear pain or difficulty swallowing. Early intervention provides the best outcome. Avoiding tobacco products and vaccinating against HPV are also important. If you have questions about this, ask your healthcare provider or dentist. Marianne Hickey RN

Dear Bosco Catholic School Students,

Thank you for contacting me about the Students First Act. Since my start in the Senate, I have been encouraged by the number of students and young people seeking to get involved in the legislative process. I certainly appreciate your interest.

As you know, on January 24, 2023, Governor Reynolds signed the Students First Act into law. This legislation will allow every Iowa family to elect to have the State deposit an estimated \$7,598 into an Education Savings Account (ESA) to pay for tuition, fees, and other qualified education expenses if they choose to enroll their child in a private school. To ensure sustained support of our public school system, the law provides additional funding to be funneled back into a student's local public school district should a parent choose to enroll their child in a private school. This law will be implemented in phases over the next three years.

As a United States Senator, I am unable to vote on matters pending before the Iowa Legislature. However, you may be interested to know that I recently cosponsored the Academic Partnerships Lead Us to Success (APLUS) Act. If enacted, this bill would allow states to opt-out of any grant program within the Elementary and Secondary Education Act and instead receive those funds in the form of a block grant—which is a sum of money awarded by the federal government to a state or local government. States would then be able to spend the federal dollars from that block grant on educational expenses as they see fit based on the needs of their student population. State and local officials are best positioned to make policy decisions related to education and how to best utilize funds to improve educational outcomes.

All children deserve a chance to achieve success regardless of where they are born and the situations their families face. Having grown up in rural Southwest Iowa, my parents often stressed the importance of a strong education. In Iowa, we are fortunate to have one of the best public school systems in the nation; of which, I am a proud product—as is my daughter. We must fight for all students, including those attending public, private, and charter schools, and students who require additional support due to disabilities. Parents know their child best, and elected officials should protect their ability to choose the type of education their child receives.

I applaud you for your interest in these matters and hope you continue to stay informed on important issues facing our nation. Feel free to contact my office with any additional questions, as I always enjoy hearing from Iowans.
