Nurse's Notes

How do you plan for your weekly meals? Is it a last minute thought or do you work off a plan? Spring can be a busy time. Time spent planning can save you time in the future. Some basic tips for meal planning include checking out the freezer, refrigerator and pantry to see what you have available. This could save you money by using what you already have on hand. Consider using a worksheet with the 7 days on it. This will assist you in making your list of what you may need. Make a list of recipes you would like to try based on what you have on hand and the time available for meal preparation. Consider prepping meals on weekends when you may have more time available and then heat them during the week for a quick meal. Plan how to use leftovers; this includes ingredients used in recipes.
