Education Savings Account (ESA) Update:

Families,

Our administrative team recently attended a conference about ESA's. We are SO BLESSED that the Governor signed the Student First Act into law and fast tracked it so that it can be in place by next school year. Fast tracking can also lead to some frustrations but the END IN MIND is what we keep our eyes on!

Here's what we know:

- There will be an application process through a company called Odyssey. It is expected to be up and running by the end of May.
- ALL APPLICATIONS MUST BE COMPLETE BY JUNE 30 OF THIS YEAR. (Yes, that is a short window but doable.) There is no cost to apply.
 - If you are a current family and are close to that 300% poverty level, you should complete the application!
 - All kindergarten and NEW families transferring from a public school HAVE TO APPLY by June 30!
 IF YOU MISS THAT CUT OFF YOU WILL NOT BE ABLE TO APPLY AGAIN UNTIL THE
 FOLLOWING YEAR. (This means that you will be responsible for tuition if you do not apply.)
- We (Bosco Schools) will continue to communicate with you as we learn more. As soon as the application process becomes available WE WILL LET YOU KNOW!
 - We will ALSO be hosting help sessions so that you can come to our campus and we will help you
 apply if you need it.
 - Please note that Odyssey assured us that it is going to be a very simple, 5-6 minute application. You will NOT have to provide or upload any financial data; you will provide your social security number and that will allow Odyssey to access the IRS to gather your tax data.
 - What they told us is that you will know almost immediately after submitting the application whether you will be approved or not. There will also be an appeal process.

As I said, there are still a lot of questions and unknowns but be assured that we here at Bosco will continue to keep you informed as more information becomes available!

Nurse's Notes


What do you know about sugar? Sugar not only adds inches to our waistline it is also harmful to our cardiovascular health. The American Heart Association recommends no more than 25 grams of added sugar for women and children and 36 grams for men. Reading labels for sugar content is a great place to start looking for hidden sugars. Breakfast cereal should have less than 10-12 grams. One serving of "Fruit Loops" has 14.5 grams of sugar. One "Pop Tart" can have 12 grams of sugar. Yogurt can also be full of sugar. A carton of "Yoplait Strawberry Yogurt" has 19 grams of sugar. Try serving plain yogurt with added fruit. Ketchup, barbeque sauce and salad dressings can have between 8-12 grams per serving. Ketchup has almost 4 grams per tablespoon. Read labels for drinks. One 12 ounce can of "Mountain Dew" has 46 grams. Flavored sports drinks and milks can have added sugar. Other names for sugar may include syrups, words ending with "ose" or you may just see sugar in the name such as brown sugar. Marianne Hickey RN


