### **Before-School Supervision**

The doors for St. Mary Center will be open at 7:10. All preschool students riding the transfer bus need to be dropped off at 7:15, as the transfer bus leaves at 7:20. If it is after 7:20, you can drop your child off at the IC doors and your child may go directly to his or her classroom. Students arriving after 7:30 must stop in the office before going to their classroom. Students not in their classroom by 7:30 will be marked tardy.

## Morning drop off

As a **Leader in Me** school we encourage our students to find their voice. Habit One is Be Proactive - You are in charge of You. We strongly encourage parents to drop students off in the morning at St. Mary Center between 7:10-7:20 to walk to their classroom with their classmates. If you must drop students off after 7:20, drop off at Entrance 6. Please say your goodbyes at the door. We will help students get to their classroom.

#### School Pictures

K-8 students will have their picture taken on Thursday, September 7. This will be an out of uniform day. Students may wear nice jeans/shorts with an appropriate shirt. No spaghetti straps, tank tops, or hats may be worn.

St. Joseph Preschool pictures will be taken on Friday, September 8.

#### Bus Information

For kindergarten students riding a Waterloo bus, an adult must be waiting for that student each day. He/she cannot be dropped off if the bus driver does not see that someone is there.

Only Students routed on a Waterloo bus may ride.

#### Spirit Days

Wednesdays will be "Spirit Days". Students may wear any kind of crew neck IC/St. Joseph, Don Bosco shirt with uniform pants. The shirt can be specific to a particular sport if desired (for example, wrestling, football, volleyball). It can be long- or short-sleeved, t-shirt or sweatshirt. Collared uniform shirts need not be worn underneath. No hooded sweatshirts.

#### Water Bottles

Having an easy-to-use bottle that doesn't require unscrewing the cap and screwing it back on for every drink will certainly be appreciated. Spill-proof caps and sport-tops are a great choice. NO glass bottles please.

#### What is SCRIP?

SCRIP is fundraising for our school while you shop and purchase items that you are already buying. This doesn't cost you any more than you are already spending.

## Why should I use Scrip?

When you purchase Scrip, you earn tuition credit based on your purchases. 50% of the profit earned on your purchase is applied to your school account as a tuition credit. You can reduce the amount of your tuition simply by purchasing Scrip on a regular basis for things you are already buying. Everyone needs groceries and the car always needs gas. Two simple ways to help the school without even trying. Thank you all for using Scrip and spread the word how simple it is to use.



## **SOM Information**

It has definitely been an interesting and unique start to our school year and we are only about a week in! Overall, things have been going well but I wanted to bring you up to speed with transportation and our effort to keep the buildings as comfortable as possible with this unusual fall heat.

If you are not familiar with me or my position, my name is Tom Hogan and I'm the School Operations Manager for BCSS. My position oversees facilities and grounds, transportation, technology, athletics/activities, lunch program, and our preschool/ABC program.

This year Waterloo Schools has partnered with First Student Bus Company for the first time in many years. As you have probably seen on the news (or may have experienced first hand) they have been struggling with routes and finding drivers. We want you to know that we are working hard to get our three routes with the Waterloo Schools and First Student straightened out so pickup and dropoff has minimal interruptions to our families. If anyone continues to have issues please make sure you let me know and we will continue to try and solve these issues.

Our maintenance/custodial staff continues to work on keeping our facilities at a comfortable temperature for a positive learning environment during this unexpected fall heatwave. Since our classrooms are not air conditioned we have been taking steps at night and in the early mornings to cool the rooms. We have added more fans to our collection and have placed them strategically in hallways to keep the air moving. Next week looks to be another hot one and we already have a plan in place to try and combat the heat as much as possible.

I'm honored to serve the BCSS community and welcome any suggestions for the improvement of our schools. My purpose here is to serve the needs of the students and the greater school community.
