Do you know your risk factors? Risk factors are characteristics, attributes or exposures that increase your chances of developing a disease or health disorder. Smoking or tobacco use, being overweight, alcohol use, and physical inactivity are risks we can control. Family history or genetics is not. Discuss what your risk factors are with your primary care provider and take steps to reduce your health risk. Find out what you can do to decrease your chances of having a chronic illness. It is time to give up tobacco products. Can you eat less processed foods and more fruits and vegetables? Is it time to get serious about losing a few pounds? Even losing 10 pounds improves your health. Can you make a plan to put on those tennis shoes and get in a few more steps? Be an advocate for your health. Who can use Scrip?

Anyone can use Scrip. Parents, students, teachers, administrators, grandparents, neighbors, and businesses. Anyone who is interested in supporting our school system or in reducing their tuition for themselves or for their family members can do so by purchasing Scrip. Ask your parents, brothers, and sisters to purchase Scrip and apply the tuition credit to your account. Anyone who purchases Scrip and does not have any students in school and wants to give their rebate credit to another family can do so by filling out a form to indicate who the credit should go to. You can also split your credit among more than one family.

How does SCRIP generate funds for us?

The Great Lakes Scrip center acts on behalf of churches, schools and other non-profit organizations to purchase large amounts of Scrip from grocery stores, department stores, and other retailers. Because the Scrip is purchased with cash up front, the participating retailers offer a substantial discount. Our organization buys the Scrip from Great Lakes Scrip Center at a discount, and resells the certificates at face value. 50% of the discount from two to fifteen percent or more - is retained by us, the Bosco catholic School System, as revenue. This program contributes a substantial amount of money to our school system each year.

"Get to Know the STO"-- How does it work?

Did you know that the 75% Tax Credit for an STO donation is the largest credit in the state of Iowa? It's a simple way to help Catholic education and a simple tax credit to use. As an example; If you expect to owe \$900 in Iowa income taxes this year, donate \$1,200 to the STO, and you'll receive a \$900 Tax Credit Certificate. Redeem the credit at tax time, and you've now eliminated your Iowa income tax liability. You'll provide \$1200 worth of STO support for only \$300, and you now owe \$0 in Iowa income tax. The Catholic Order of Foresters Matching fund Project has been sponsored by the High Court for the past 36 years. FIRST Lego League SUPER LEGO FROGS Team #4721



Parents and Students.

I would like to let you know about an exciting program available at Immaculate Conception School for students in grades 6-8. *FIRST LEGO LEAGUE CHALLENGE (FLL)* is a robotics program which is designed to get students excited about science and technology – and teach them valuable employment and life skills. Small teams of 2-10 students program an autonomous robot to score points on a predetermined mat, do research and create an innovative solution to a problem as part of a Project, and are guided through everything they do by the FLL Core Values. These three elements - the Robot Game, Project, and FLL Core Values make up the yearly FLL Challenge.

This year's challenge is Cargo Connect. In this year's FIRST LEGO League Challenge season, CARGO CONNECT, students will get creative and use their critical thinking and imaginations to **explore how cargo** is transported, sorted, and delivered to its destinations. https://www.firstinspires.org/robotics/fll/game-and-season

The team generally meets twice per week after school Tuesday/Thursday, 2:30-4:30pm to prepare for a tournament which takes place early to mid-December. Students are also expected to do research/work on their own in support of their team's efforts. (The team does occasionally meet on weekends and/or during vacation periods at other locations and may have outings as part of their research.)

This is an intensive program which takes significant time, especially during the tournament season. Since this is a team activity, students must be dedicated to working both independently and with the rest of their group and to participating throughout their time on the team in order to ensure the group's greatest chances of success.

At the tournament teams are judged on their robot (mechanical design, programming and strategy), their project (research, innovative solution and presentation) and their "core values" (inspiration, teamwork and gracious professionalism) and also compete in a robot competition. Teams that do well enough at the tournament may advance to a state championship tournament that will be held in January. Teams that do well enough at that tournament may advance to national or international tournaments held from April through July.

It's never too early to start thinking about college. There are college scholarships available for students who have participated in *FIRST* programs such FLL, FTC, and FRC. Bosco does have a FIRST Tech Challenge team at the high school. The high school counselor has scholarship information available.

Our first introductory meetings will be Tuesday, September 14 at 2:30pm. Please email me if your child is interested in participating in FLL. The FLL room is located on the the second floor of the high school. I will meet the team in the middle school hallway and escort them to the new room on Tuesday.
