

Kathy taught K-Grade 8 art and middle school reading and language arts at Immacluate Conception. A University of Northern Iowa graduate, she began her teaching career in Waterloo before moving to Immaculate Conception where she taught for 37 years. Kathy was full of practical art information and shared it with her students daily. Christmas was a special time with her students making ornaments for their homes, never repeating a design over the many years. She loved when Don Bosco students shared what they were working on in art and when graduates shared how art was part of their lives after Bosco. Kathy never missed a concert at school and often videotaped them for the teachers. She was always willing to help out wherever there was a need. Kathy passed away on November 29, 2018, so we presented her award posthumously to her family.


# **Class Reunion Updates**
