New Principal Announced

Chairperson Wayne Frost and the Bosco Catholic School System School Board, is pleased to announce that Shelby Douglas will assume the responsibilities as Principal for the entire K-12 system beginning with the 2022-2023 school year. The decision by our current high school Principal to leave this position opened up several choices for the School Board. After prayerful consultation with the Archdiocese of Dubuque the School Board chose to expand Mrs. Douglas's current role as the Principal for K-8 to that of K-12. In support of this expanded role the school will hire a School Operations Manager to handle the administrative functions of the school not related to instruction and student development, allowing Mrs. Douglas to focus on the spiritual, academic, physical and social development of the students. changes will take effect on July 1st, 2022.



Changes and Updates


If you haven't been on campus for a while then you may not have seen our latest updates:

- Both the Immaculate Conception and Don Bosco bathrooms have been updated and improved. Thanks to Huff Construction for their great work.
- Don Bosco High School is in the middle of a project to replace all of the original flooring. The upstairs and north hallways, upstairs and north classrooms, stairs, and bandroom have been completed. The South hallway classrooms will be done this summer with the main hallway and offices done in 2023. This has been accomplished due to several donors including one large anonymous donation of \$100,000.

- This summer the dirt parking lot (old St. Mary's site) will be paved in conjunction with the church. This is possible through a large donation from the Jim Schmitz Family.





Alumni News 2022 Distinguished Alumni Awards

The Don Bosco High School Distinguished Graduate Hall of Fame will honor three new members at this year's graduation ceremony on May 22nd.

- Larry Delagardelle-Class of 1963. His service to the Bosco System as a school board member and multiple-term board president was vital to the sustainability of the Bosco Catholic School System. He contributed whenever there was a financial need to both the Bosco System and to St. Francis, Barclay Parish, often anonymously paying a student's tuition. A key supporter of the annual "Bus Bash", he also supported the Bosco athletic programs for many years. He served on the committees to select multiple principals for the high school and elementary school. He worked with the Archdiocese to help keep tuition low for all students in the system and was an early advocate for providing technology to the schools and students. While serving as BCSS Board President he passed away on September 3, 2013. Larry was married to Jackie, and they had four children graduate from DBHS.
- John Weber-Class of 1964. As the senior class president, he began a long career of leadership. After graduation from Loras College he was drafted into the Army and sent to Vietnam where he was awarded the Bronze Star. Upon completing his tour of duty, he returned to lowa and went to work for John Deere at the Parts Distribution Center where he rose through the ranks over a 27-year career. He served as the Grand Knight in the Knights of Columbus and made a Christian Experience Weekend (spiritual retreat) in 1986 and then served on the leadership team 25 times in 34 years. After 5 years of study and formation John was ordained a Deacon In 2002. He continues to serve Our Lady of Lourdes parish, Bettendorf, Iowa in this capacity today. John was a Charter member of the "One Foundation", a Quad Cities non-profit organization to help disabled persons with housing and furniture needs. He has also served as the Chairman of the Board of Directors for the River Bend Food Bank, helping them grow from 3.8 million to over 19 million meals served annually and was instrumental as chairman when they moved to their new larger warehouse. He also served 10 yrs. as a volunteer for Cafe on Vine, a soup kitchen in Davenport's Inner City. John is married to fellow DBHS alum Dotty (Schons) and all three of their children graduated from Davenport Assumption High School.
- Pam Schmitz Delagardelle-Class of 1980. Pam started her career in health care as a nurse in 1983. She successfully moved up through the ranks in healthcare from Director of Patient Care to Managed Care Facilitator, to Clinical Integration Coordinator, and eventually to CEO of UnityPoint Health-Allen Hospital. She also served as an Assistant Professor at Allen College in Waterloo. Under Pam's leadership, the hospitals, and systems she's managed have won numerous awards for safety, patient care and patient satisfaction. Pam earned her bachelor's degree of Science in Nursing from Mount Mercy in 1984. She earned her master's degree of Science in Nursing Administration from the University of Iowa in 1997, with an emphasis on hospital and business administration. She has received the Mount Mercy University Distinguished Service Award in 2012 and was a participant in the Success Follows alumni outcomes project. Pam has served on numerous professional and community boards as a member and chair, including the Iowa Hospital Association, Iowa Hospital Education and Research Foundation Board, and HealthNet Connect Board. She has served Holy Family Parish in many capacities, including new church committee chair and capital campaign chair, Sacristan, Liturgist and Volunteer, and has served on the Saint Edward's School Board of Education. She is a member of Sigma Theta Tau Nursing Honor Society, Kappa Xi Chapter. She is married to fellow DBHS alum Rick and has five children.







Fine Arts Hall of Fame Inductions

Patricia Brennan - Class of '66 – 2020 Fine Arts Hall of Fame, is the author of twenty-six books for young readers, including picture books, photodocumentaries, and biographies. During the past ten years, Pat has authored eleven Who Was...?/What Was...? books—a popular series of biographies and history books published by Penguin Random House for ages 8–11. Two million copies of her books are in print worldwide. They've been translated into several languages including Spanish, Romanian, Arabic, Vietnamese, simplified Chinese, and Turkish. Her most recent book is *Who Is Ruth Bader Ginsburg?* A high point of her career was interviewing the Supreme Court Justice in her chambers in Washington, D.C. in 2017.

Pat recalls her first publication experience, writing articles for The Bosco Bugle at Don Bosco. Today, when she speaks to schools, she encourages budding authors to write for their school papers. She married Jack Demuth, a '67 Don Bosco graduate and photographer, so they broke into publishing together by doing photodocumentaries—Pat wrote the text and Jack took the photos.

A book especially meaningful to Pat and Jack was *Joel Growing Up a Farm Man*, which documented the life of a boy on a family farm. It was chosen Best Book of the Year by the Society of Midland Authors and became a Junior Literary Guild selection. Additional awards for Pat's books include the Georgia Children's Storybook Award; Outstanding Science Book from the National Science Teachers Association; nomination for one of the "Top Books of the Century" for Instructor Magazine; and Outstanding Book in Social Sciences from National Council for the Social Studies.

Pat lives in Evanston, Illinois, the mother of two grown sons and three grandchildren. Her website can be found at brennan-demuth.com.

Mary Merkel- Hess - Class of '67- 2022 Fine Arts Hall of Fame. Merkel-Hess's drawing talent was noticed early, and she began to make paintings while still in high school. In the early 1970s Merkel-Hess began to study art. A three-month stay in Italy further deepened her artistic interests and she returned to the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee to study fiber and metal smithing, receiving a BFA in 1976. Toward the end of her graduate studies, at the University of Iowa she began making rugose (folded) metal vessels and as an extension, paper ones. Upon graduation she became a full-time studio artist with breaks to teach and do workshops. She has even developed her own techniques for working with paper.

Her work is exhibited widely and is in many private and public collections including the Metropolitan Museum of Art, New York; the Museum of Art and Design, New York; the Philadelphia Museum of Art, Pennsylvania; the Renwick Gallery, National Museum of American Art, Smithsonian Institute, Washington, DC.

She lives in Iowa City and is married to Stephen Merkel-Hess, a retired teacher. They have two adult children and three grandchildren.
